

Dr. Bhansali is a board-certified Pediatric Hospital Medicine (PHM) specialist. She has been working at Children's National Hospital since 2009. Dr. Bhansali is the Director of the Children's Academy of Pediatric Educators, a group of 40 individuals recognized for excellence in educational leadership and scholarship, who focus on education research, innovation in teaching, and faculty development in education. Dr. Bhansali is also the Assistant Chief of Scholarship and Faculty Development in the Hospital Medicine Division and the Associate Program Director for the Pediatric Hospital Medicine fellowship, one of the nation's most established PHM fellowship programs.
